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Kids Weaving Monster Scarf

Kids will love this scarf with its fun monster mitts! Recommended Age: 7+

Finished Measurements: Length: 60" (152 cm)



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Supplies:

- 2 Skeins (Color A) – Red Heart® Gum Drop™, Lemon (or your choice of color or comparable yarn)
- 1 Skein (Color B) – Loops & Threads® Impeccable®, Clear Blue (or your choice of color or comparable yarn)
- 1 Set of Clover Weaving Sticks (Fine)
- 1 – Yarn Needle, your choice

Additional items:

- Wiggle eyes (2)
- Glue

Scarf

Use 6 fine Weaving Sticks.

Step 1: Cut 6 lengths of Color A yarn each 120" (305 cm). Thread each weaving stick with the yarn doubling it by pulling yarn to its center. This is the warp.

Step 2: Follow package instructions for weaving with 3 or more weaving sticks.

Step 3: Weave on 6 sticks with Color A yarn for approx. 60" (152.5). Making sure to always have at least 2–3" (6–7.5 cm) of weave on your sticks until your project is complete.

Step 4: Tie weaving yarn to the last stick; cut the yarn leaving an approx. 5" (13 cm) tail. Push all of the weaving yarn off the sticks and center on the warp. To secure your work, tie off any excess warp thread on each end and trim.

Pockets

To create the pockets: Fold up the last 5" (13 cm) on both ends of the scarf. Use darning needle and yarn to sew edges together. Use glue to add a Wiggle Eye on each pocket.

Fringe

Use a 10" (25.5 cm) strand of Color B yarn and fold it in half. Insert the folded end into the top edge of pocket. Use a crochet hook or fingers to grab the two strands of yarn and pull them through the loop. Gently pull on strands of yarn to draw them down snugly. Continue adding fringe along the top edge. Trim ends to even the fringe.

Tip:

When wrapping the yarn around the sticks, push each strand of yarn close to the one below for better coverage.



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
